What happens if my equipment needs to be repaired?

If purchased via your funding package, or other private funding, you are responsible for the cost of any repairs/maintenance. Please contact the supplier who provided the equipment to arrange this.

What happens if I need my equipment modified or replaced? Before your equipment can be modified or replaced, you will need an assessment by an Occupational Therapist or Physiotherapist.

Following discharge from YACDS, you have several options available to you.

Option 1: If you attend a day centre with therapy services attached e.g SCOPE or Yooralla

Option 2: You could refer yourself to your local community health centre.

Option 3: Medicare Enhanced Primary Care Program **Option 4:** Access OT or Physiotherapy privately

Respite is when someone else provides care to the person you support so you can have a break. If you have a case manager they will be able to assist you to explore respite options

OTHOTICS

Orthoses (braces, splints, AFO's) and specialist shoes can be supplied by private providers or by St Vincent's or other public hospitals.

Please note **there is no Medicare funding of orthoses.** Funding options for orthoses and shoes include:

- Self pay
- Government funding schemes eg StateWide Equipment Program (SWEP), NDIS.
- Private health insurance (check coverage with your insurer).

These options apply whether orthoses are supplied by a public hospital or a private company.

What do I do if I need a review or replacement of my orthosis or shoes?

Option 1: While being seen by YACDS you can be seen by the YACDS orthotist at St Vincent's Hospital in Fitzroy.

Option 2: You can access a private orthotist closer to home. If you are already seeing a private orthotist you can maintain continuity of care by continuing to see them. YACDS can assist you in finding a suitable orthotist.

After discharge from YACDS you can be seen by the Orthotics Department of St Vincent's Hospital as an outpatient, or by a private orthotist.

THERAPY SERVICES

Community Health Centre	All community health centres have different criteria it is best to contact your local CHC to ask them what they need for a referral	Focus on long term illness / disability Allied health e.g physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech pathology, podiatry and dietetics Nursing care and counselling
Community Rehabilitation Centre	You will need to visit your G.P to get a referral	Short term goal focused rehabilitation. Access to all allied health services and specialised clinics e.g. continence clinic and falls and balance group.
